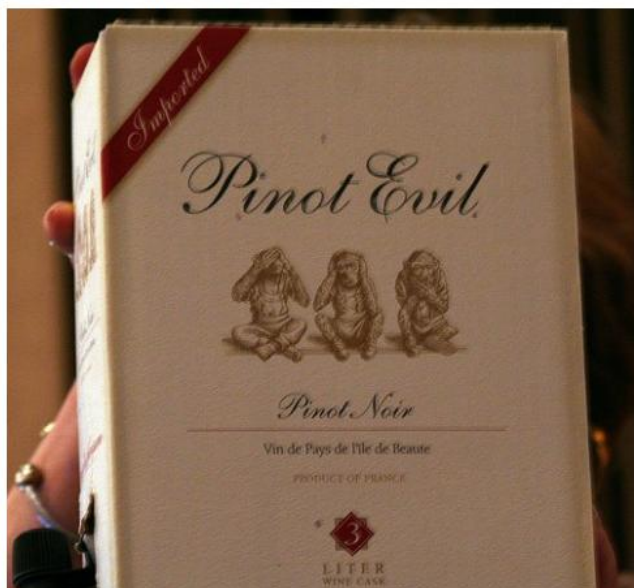
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Target Wine Cube Sangria



Not that Sangria is particularly hard to make, but it's nice that Target has done all the work for you. Available in packages equal to a couple of glasses up to 4 bottles, this Sangria is ready to go right out of the box, or you can jazz it up with some extra fruit or soda water for fizz.

Pinot Evil Pinot Noir



A quality French wine in a box is hard display to pass up. While not revolutionary in any way, the mild, fruity flavors of the wine are perfect for an upgraded table wine that's great for enjoying while watching TV and noshing on some delivered pizza – a step up from your usual blended red table wines.

Octavin Home Wine Bar Silver Birch Sauvignon Blanc



A new package that's attractive enough to be left out even when company is over. With a top quality twist spigot that won't drip wine all over your floor, this New Zealand Sauvignon Blanc is perfect for light appetizers, chicken, or by itself on a hot day. Flavors of citrus are crisp and refreshing.

Octavin Home Wine Bar Big House Red



Another offering from Octavin that might actually be the most perfect red table wine. A blend of Syrah, Petite Sirah, Grenache, Montepulciano, Mourvedre, Sangiovese, Alghiano, Tannat, Nero D'Avola, Sargentino, Touriga, Barbera, and Petit Verdot – it has a little of everything. While not doing anything particularly well, it doesn't do anything poorly either and will match up with just about anything you'd want a glass of red wine for, especially relaxing after a long day.



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Black Box Sauvignon Blanc



Another New Zealand Sauvignon Blanc, this one features a bit more of a dry finish while still offering up the same crisp acidity and tropical fruit flavors that are associated with Sauvignon Blanc. A great buy for anybody that eats copious amounts of seafood as this will pair wonderfully with it.

Bota Box Old Vine Zinfandel



Old Vine Zinfandel by itself is a great wine, when offered in high volume at a great price it's even better. The Bota Box Old Vine Zinfandel is dark and jammy with aromas of blackberry and dark cherry. Spice and pepper on the finish with a hint of vanilla and just the right amount of tannins make this the perfect wine for pairing with a hearty meal of pasta, pizza, or BBQ.s

French Rabbit Pinot Noir



Another French Pinot with earthy notes of fresh raspberry and strawberry on the nose with flavors of ripe red fruit on the palate. A step up from the Pinot Evil that will pair well with grilled meats, particularly pork and salmon.
